## If you have an infant or very young child that is not talking:

Babbling (making vocalization sounds) is an important stage in a child's language development. Before a child can say words he needs to be able to make the more basic sounds that make up words. That is where the abc book is beneficial. Just take a minute or two reading this book to your child each day. Have fun and exaggerate (be silly) saying the letters and the sounds they make. As the months pass your child will probably try to imitate you. Our own experience is that it was over a year before our daughter responded.

When printing set the page scaling to actual size (100%). Do not shrink to fit.

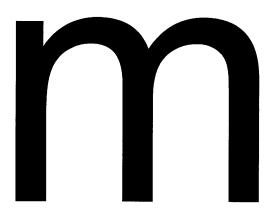

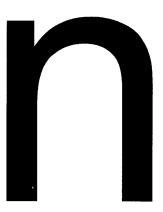
Spend only a minute or two a day with this book. Read it once each weekday with your child. If your child will not sit for the complete book, read only the first five letters until he is able to attend to more.

Always use this book in a loving and caring way -never drill your child.

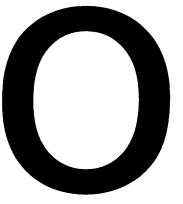
